## PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Program Description: This one day conference focuses on areas of anatomic and therapeutic convergence between Urology and Gynecology. The content is presented through a combination of scientific advances, review of current clinical guidelines and case discussions presented by faculty and participants, important topics will include:

1. Updates on general and urologic considerations in pregnant patients
2. Infertility from the male and female perspective
3. Sexual rehabilitation after pelvic oncologic surgery
4. Updates on Pelvic reconstruction in patients with pelvic prolapse and fecal incontinence
5. Management of iatrogenic injuries to the urinary and genital systems
6. Urinary and genital reconstruction in patients with pelvic tumors

## KEY EDUCATIONAL POINTS:

The overall objective of this CME activity is to have urologists and obstetrician/gynecologists present in the same forum to address common pitfalls in management of disease processes that are shared by the two specialties. Hopefully, some of the knowledge gaps present in each specialty can be answered by members of the other specialty,

1. Surgical and medical treatment of pregnant patients. Review issues such as radiation exposure, timing of surgery, and medication use during pregnancy, management of renal failure and urolithiasis in pregnancy
2. Treatment and cost-effective strategies for infertility work-ups and treatment.
3. New information on sexual rehabilitation after radical pelvic surgery, including recent work on clinical trials for penile rehabilitation post-prostatectomy.
4. Avoidance of errors that lead to intraoperative injuries including ureteral, bladder and female genital injuries which cause perioperative morbidity.
5. New information on pelvic anatomy and the interplay of bowel and bladder function that makes pelvic prolapse reconstruction a rapidly changing field.
6. New information on minimally invasive techniques for pelvic reconstruction.
7. Common pitfalls in pelvic oncologic surgery that result in morbidity and poor patient outcomes.
