The University of Virginia Health System has received ASHP-accreditation for 3 residency programs: Critical Care (established 2002), Drug Information (established 1998), and Pharmacy Practice (established 1991). Meet the Residency Class of 2005-6

Helen Choi Pharmacy Practice

Dr. Choi's residency project will assess the adherence to a tiotropium interchange for maintenance treatment of chronic obstructive pulmonary disease patients.
