<p>Expectations</p>	<p>When you are on service with the Psych Department in the hospital, we expect you to attend the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Chairman’s Rounds – Tuesdays at 7:15AM in the Department Library (group room during interview season) 2. Grand Rounds – Tuesdays at 3:00 PM in the Camp Heart Auditorium 3. PGY I Group – Wednesdays 12:30-1:30 with Patty Porterfield in the Department Group Room 4. PGY I Seminars – Fridays 12:30-1:30 in the Group Room (location may vary) and Mondays beginning in February. <p>When you are off rotation, your first responsibility is to that service and you are expected to attend those educational activities.</p> <p>You are responsible for the material for each seminar whether or not you attend the seminar.</p> <p>Please sign in at all activities and evaluate your presenters. <p>Evaluations</p>	<p>During each rotation, on- or off- service, you should receive:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. A verbal mid rotation evaluation with your attending 2. A formal evaluation by all attendings on the rotation that worked with you for one or more weeks. 3. Evaluations from the medical students 4. In future, an evaluation from the nursing staff <p>You should evaluate your attending!</p> <p>In addition, you should meet with your long term supervisor weekly for 1 hour for individual supervision. Competencies	<p>It is our goal to develop competency testing that is valid and relevant to the goals of our program and to the ACGME. The ongoing evaluations are meant to measure progress and ability but also to provide feedback throughout your educational experience. A variety of tools will be used for evaluation in order to provide the most fair and useful assessment of skills and ability.</p>	
Other items to know.	<p>Western State Oral Exam Practice – This is a practice for the exam that is taken at the end of the PGY II year. It is necessary to pass this exam before moving to PGY III. Time for the practice has been incorporated into the PGY I Seminar Schedule in late April and May.</p> <p>The Resident Retreat will be held on February 12 and 13 and attendance is mandatory. Please clear your schedules for the evening on February 12 and all day on the 13th.</p> <p>PGY I have \$300 in book \$ for the year. Books must be purchased by 5/15 and \$ cannot be carried over to the next year. A list of approved books is on the web and also in the resident room. Books that are not on the list must be approved by Dr.s Kantor or Dameron.
